- 1 "I am the true vine, and my Father is the gardener.
- 2 He cuts off every branch in me that bears no fruit, while every branch that does bear fruit he prunes so that it will be even more fruitful.
- 3 You are already clean because of the word I have spoken to you.

Spring 2024 Call to Service: Make and Share Personal Dignity Kits,

A mission project for Mt. Healthy UMC

in connection with Midwest Mission

Understanding that some people *really don't have* the basic necessities, we'll be collecting items for Personal Dignity Kits on the following Sundays: *April 28, May 5, May 12, May 19, and May 26.* A container for donations will be on table in back of sanctuary. Adult Sunday School members will assemble the kits.

We need one of each of these items for each kit:1 Hand Towel1 Wash Cloth1 Adult Toothbrush1 Bar Soap, 3-4 oz1 Shampoo, 12-19 oz1 Deodorant, 2-3 oz1 Lotion, 8-10 oz1 Toothpaste

Cash donations and a few boxes of 1 gallon resealable plastic bags will also be accepted. We need bags to contain the kits and we must provide \$8.00 per kit to cover delivery costs. Cash donations should go into offering envelopes and into offering plates during services.

Last May our church donated 33 personal hygiene kits that were delivered to Midwest Mission at the West Ohio Annual Conference.

Whatever we gather this year will be delivered during Annual Conference on 5.30.24

Post-Secondary Scholarships Available to Members

Going off to college or other post-secondary school is expensive!

Perhaps we can help!

Scholarships for post-secondary tuition expenses are available to students who have been a member of Mt. Healthy United Methodist Church for at least one year, and have evidence of active participation, leader-ship and service at Mt. Healthy (or the church where the student attends school) at least one year prior to application.

Additional qualifications include:

• Studying for the ministry, other church-related vocation, or similar service-type vocation which includes (but is not limited to) education-related careers (teacher, librarian), and medicine and healthcare (doctor, nurse, pharmacist, lab technician, physical therapist, dietician, counselor, social work).

• Acceptance in an accredited school of higher education

Maintain high grade standards – a C+ average or equivalent point value

In addition, the Scholarship Committee will consider the financial need of the applicant, scholastic and attendance records, character and development, and attitude of the applicant concerning his/her desire to continue the education process, and his/her reason for choice of career.

All scholarships awarded are to pay <u>tuition only</u>, and are paid directly to the school. Scholarships will be awarded as adequate funds are available, and amounts of scholarship awards may be limited by number of applicants.
