1 Meanwhile Saul, still breathing threats and murder against the disciples of the Lord, went to the high priest 2 and asked him for letters to the synagogues at Damascus, so that if he found any who belonged to the Way, men or women, he might bring them bound to Jerusalem. 3 Now as he was going along and approaching Damascus, suddenly a light from heaven flashed around him. 4 He fell to the ground and heard a voice saying to him, "Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?" 5 He asked, "Who are you, Lord?" The reply came, "I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting. 6 But get up and enter the city, and you will be told what you are to do." 7 The men who were traveling with him stood speechless because they heard the voice but saw no one. 8 Saul got up from the ground, and though his eyes were open, he could see nothing; so they led him by the hand and brought him into Damascus. 9 For three days he was without sight and neither ate nor drank. 10 Now there was a disciple in Damascus named Ananias. The Lord said to him in a vision, "Ananias." He answered, "Here I am, Lord." 11 The Lord said to him, "Get up and go to the street called Straight, and at the house of Judas look for a man of Tarsus named Saul. #### Post-Secondary Scholarships Available to Members

Going off to college or other post-secondary school is expensive! Perhaps we can help!

Scholarships for post-secondary tuition expenses are available to students who have been a member of Mt. Healthy United Methodist Church for at least one year, and have evidence of active participation, leadership and service at Mt. Healthy (or the church where the student attends school) at least one year prior to application.

Additional qualifications include:

Studying for the ministry, other church-related vocation, or similar service-type vocation which includes (but is not limited to) education-related careers (teacher, librarian), and medicine and healthcare (doctor, nurse, pharmacist, lab technician, physical therapist, dietician, counselor, social work).

Acceptance in an accredited school of higher education

Maintain high grade standards - a C+ average or equivalent point value

In addition, the Scholarship Committee will consider the financial need of the applicant, scholastic and attendance records, character and development, and attitude of the applicant concerning his/her desire to continue the education process, and his/her reason for choice of career.

All scholarships awarded are to pay tuition only, and are paid directly to the school. Scholarships will be awarded as adequate funds are available, and amounts of scholarship awards may be limited by number of applicants.
